Opera Baltimore brings pop-up museum and free concerts to six branches of the Enoch Pratt Free Library with its 'Opera on the Avenue' programming

Baltimore, MD - January 11, 2023 - Opera Baltimore's ongoing civic practice project titled "Opera on the Avenue," celebrates the life of African-American soprano Anne Wiggins Brown, the first Bess in Gershwin's iconic opera *Porgy and Bess.* Ms. Brown grew up in Old West Baltimore just off Pennsylvania Avenue, and received her formative musical training here. Still relatively unknown in her own city, Opera on the Avenue seeks to amplify this trailblazer's journey, celebrate her legacy, and uplift the stories of African-American artists from Baltimore.

Over the next six months, Opera Baltimore's "pop-up museum installation" about the life of Anne Brown and other prominent West Baltimoreans will travel to six different branches of the Enoch Pratt Free Library. Opera Baltimore will also offer a free afternoon concert at each branch, highlighting Anne Brown's contributions to Baltimore and the operatic artform.
