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# Opera Baltimore brings grand opera to Baltimore once again with a lush staging of Verdi's *La Traviata*

**Baltimore**, **MD** - **February 20**, **2023** - Opera Baltimore will present Verdi's iconic romantic opera *La Traviata* next month in Towson. The opera will premiere March 24th at Towson University's Stephens Hall with a second matinee performance on March 26th, followed by two performances at The Grand in Wilmington, DE on March 31st and April 2nd hosted by OperaDelaware. This co-production represents a continued collaboration between the two opera companies to bring top talent to both communities. All performances will feature full orchestra, spectacular voices, stunning scenery, and beautiful costumes.

Celebrated soprano **Lindsay Ohse** stars as Violetta. Hailed for her "clear and powerfully stratospheric" voice (A la Carte Productions), Ohse's recent appearances include Papagena in *The Magic Flute*, Bekhetaten in *Akhnaten*, and Noemie in *Cendrillon* at the Metropolitan Opera. Internationally acclaimed tenor **Matthew Vickers**, known for roles such as Canio in *Pagliacci* and Pinkerton in *Madama Butterfly*, sings the role of Alfredo. Baritone **Benjamin Taylor** is cast as Alfredo's father, Germont. A Morgan State University graduate, Taylor has recently performed Papageno in *The Magic Flute* and Thierry in *Dialogues of the Carmelites* at the Metropolitan Opera. Rounding out the extraordinary cast are mezzo-soprano **Melanie Ashkar** as Flora Bervoix, tenor **Daniel Sampson** as Gastone de Letorières, baritone **Ben Lowe** as Barone Douphol, mezzo-soprano **Rachel DiBlasio** as Annina, baritone **Jeffrey Gates** as Marchese d'Obigny, and bass **Mark Hightower** as Dottore Grenvil.

The OperaDelaware Orchestra will play in both venues, conducted by **Maestro Domenico Boyagian**, music director of Cleveland Opera Theater and the Suburban Symphony. **Kaley Karis Smith** directs, having recently directed with major companies across the country including Houston Grand Opera, The Glimmerglass Festival and OperaDelaware. The Opera Baltimore debut of Kaley Karis Smith is partially supported by OPERA America's Opera Grants for Women Stage Directors and Conductors, generously funded by the Marineau Family Foundation.

"This will be a gorgeous traditional production filled with stellar performances crafted to touch the hearts of our audiences," says Opera Baltimore General and Artistic Director, Julia Cooke. "We are thrilled to bring this production to the greater Baltimore community."
